RESULTS, RESULTS!

For some time now we have been thinking about how best to reflect all the many achievements of our members in races. Lots of these go un reported but the fact is that there has been lots to shout about with some stand out results right across the board. So I have been asking members to report in on their race results with the aim of sharing the good news. Thanks to all those who have sent in their results to me – please keep them coming!

Here is our fourth "Results Roundup" – as ever it is only as good as the info you send in so apologies if that extra special PB is missing!

This fourth Roundup will endeavor to recapture the headlines from last month (**February 2022**). Did it ever stop raining? Certainly there were some terrific stoic performances in the face of monsoon conditions at times – hats off to all our members who ignored the worst that the weather could throw at us. So here goes......

Lots more mud to enjoy in February! All of our race reports this month feature it in one way or another except one lucky runner who escaped over to Spain – more of that in a moment!

Richard Walker kicked off the month on Saturday February 5th with a cracking Half Marathon performance in the **Grim Up North Leodis Half** - 1:30:14 and second place on a route that takes in trail, canal towpath and muddy fields – not for the faint hearted!

On the same day in virtually monsoon conditions the annual Rombalds Stride 23 mile endurance epic run by the local Scouts took place taking in much of the high moorland ground between Guiseley, Hawksworth, Burley Woodhead and Ilkley via Addingham Moorside, returning via Menston and a nice little climb up the Chevin past the Whitehouse on tired legs before finishing at Guiseley St Oswalds School. Thirteen of our gallant runners took up the challenge led home by Robbie Dawrant (4:09:15) and chased home by Sarah Lund (4:16:06), Louise Holloway – Cathcart (5:03:16), Cathy Stothers (5:03:47). Closing in fast were Gina Williams (5:12:04) and Brenda Peake (5:12:13). Just shading the six hour mark were Janice Chruscht (6:00:45), Steve Tindall (6:04:23) and Carole Keighley (6:04:45). Next a trio of Ruth Murphy (6:39:08), Sue Hulme (6:39:33) and Sharon Elms (6:39:34). Finally, still well under the 7 hour mark, Shaun Richardson (6:49.00). Congratulations all for showing "True ACP Grit" – what doesn't kill you makes you stronger!

Special mention must be made of **Evie Walker** (daughter of Richard) who took part in the **West Yorkshire Junior Cross Country Trials** – Evie was ranked 28th overall and 10th in the Leeds Schools group, an excellent performance building on her fine runs in this years Junior PECO series. A rising star!

On **Sunday 6th February** in equally wet and squally conditions the very popular **Dewsbury 10k** ran – a fast PB course in better conditions, this was a tough outing for the 2000 runners who took part. **Andrew Smith** took the race by the scruff and ran **33:43** to finish 39th out of 2,026 whilst **James Routh** ran an equally creditable **55:19**

On the same day **Andy Gledhill** took a trip to the seaside to run the **Southport"Mad Dog" 10k** in **53:22** (he said you needed to be a mad dog to run at Southport in a force 9 gale !). Meanwhile, ignoring doctors advice to rest her injured knee, **Debbie Bland** couldn't resist the lure of the **Muddy Boots 10MT** – a race that lived up to its name in all respects ! Plan A was not to run, Plan B was to jog round with the sweepers which swiftly turned into Plan C – "Go for it"! - 1hr14:49 was the outcome with the sweepers long gone. Fortunately the knee held up.

One of our members was far more fortunate with the weather – **Margaret Britton,** on holiday in Spain, raced the **Torremolinos Half marathon** and,

bathed in warm Spanish sunshine, she turned in a fine run -1:57:00 – to win her age group. Not a drop of mud in sight! Life is so unfair.....

February 13th saw **Mike Jarvis** return to racing for the second time after his Harewood heroics last month – this time taking on the **Grim Up North Settle 10k**. Mikes original race report is unprintable in its original format but suffice to say that he stuck at the task and came home 17th out of 35 in 1:01:30. The clue was in the race title Mike – Grim !!

February 23rd was the resumption of this years **Leeds 5k track series** staged at the Brownlee track in West Park – no mud here, just a bunch of fast runners bidding for glory across a series of "eyeballs out" blasts down the track. You can't keep **Andrew Humphries** away from stuff like this and he delivered a fine performance to finish 4th on the night in a competitive bunch of fast lads, running in on **16:14**. **Owain Gwilym (19:46)** and **Brenda Peake (21:38)** also turned in great performances – this is the place to come for speed work!

That all brings us once again to **PECO!**

This years PECO season all came to an exciting conclusion in this 5^{th} and last race of the series, especially for our ACP Ladies team – **Race 5** of the five race Cross country series where getting very muddy, wet and exhausted is a badge of honour.

It's a complicated format that would take a year to fully explain but essentially it's a team race where clubs race against each other with individual runners amassing points for the team and the team totals placing the club on a league ladder split into Mens and Ladies with a shorter 1 or 2 mile race for Juniors.

This fifth race in the series took place at **Roundhay Park**, **Leeds** on **20**th **February**, over an approx 4.5 mile course. All to play for in Ladies Divison 2 where promotion was tantalisingly within grasp, the team 2nd in the Division after race 4. After a full week of heavy rain Roundhay Park was a swamp and conditions could be described as "sticky" – not ideal for mounting a last push.

Despite the awful conditions on the day four ACP men and seven ladies turned up to do battle but it was all a big ask to try to haul in a strong St Theresa's ladies team and York Postal mounted a big final push to creep over the line in first place overall to clinch top spot in Ladies Division 2 (ACP in a close third) with St Theresa's taking out the Ladies Vets Div 1 title (ACP in 4th)

For the men the name of the game was consolidation and despite slipping a place in Div 2 they finished the series mid table in 6th (winners Rothwell) whilst the mens Vets team finished in 9th (winners Hyde Park).

Lots of credit to everyone who competed in some pretty dreadful conditions and lots of momentum to build on for next year.
