RESULTS, RESULTS, RESULTS!

Welcome to our third **ACP Results Roundup** of 2023.– Another great crop of results from our Pacers in **March** - this months theme is Globetrotting ! Our runners must have been watching the excellent new BBC series "Race Around the World" looking at the race reports coming into me from all corners of the globe – Guernsey, Australia, South Africa, New Zealand. Sadly it's looking as though Craig Hoos may have lost his title of "Most well travelled Pacer Racer" – but he did manage a visit to Hull right at the death !

This Roundup will endeavor to recapture the headlines from last month (**March 2023**) but as usual it makes sense to run things up to the time of writing so it also encompasses the first weekend in **April**. Slightly shorter than usual you'll be pleased to hear, because I reported on a big chunk of March in the last Roundup (up to the 12th)

Here is our seventeenth "**Results Roundup**" – as ever it is only as good as the info you send me so apologies if that extra special PB is missing !

So we pick up the action the following week (18th) with the Trail Outlaws **Kielder "Dark Skies" marathon** (a little bit longer than a marathon at 26.5 miles but no one thought of that when they created Kielder Water up in Northumberland!). As if that bit of extra distance wasn't challenge enough our four Pacers thought "why not run at night ?" The clue is in the name "Dark Skies" – this area is renowned for its wonderful views of the solar system with almost no light polution on this circuit of the huge Kielder Reservoir.

Sadly for our star gazers the Milky Way didn't show up but our runners put on a great show all of their own – **Brenda Peake** leading them home in **4:42:42**, 7th Lady / 64 and 1st Fv50 ! **Sarah Lund** was breathing down her neck in **4:42:50** (8th lady) with **Helen Ward** 10th lady in **4:44:58** and Gina Williams just a minute behind in **4:45:56** (12th lady). Sarah, Helen and Gina dominated the Fv40 group taking 6th,8th & 9th places.

Meanwhile, at the same event, **Carole Keighley** ran the 10 mile route in 1:51:49 taking out 2nd Fv60 and well up in the top third of the 393 runners.

The following day (19th) in the same part of the world **Nick Leathley** ran the **Alnwick Castle half marathon** finishing 3rd Mv60 in **2:18:34**.

Much closer to home Grim Up North staged the **Spring Canal Canter 5k** and **Rachel Jovanovic (28:18), Claire Mc Coll (28:19) and Anne Proctor** (34:47) took up the challenge.

On what turned out to be a busy weekend of racing **Liz Porteous and Debbie Bland ran** the **Keighley 10k.** Following a new route this year the race avoided the town centre and headed out towards Keighley Golf Course and then headed back along the canal towpath towards East Riddlesden where, after a bit of a bog trot across a very wet field, it emerged back on the road at East Riddlesden Hall to head back for the finish in Victoria Park. **Liz clocked 51:03** and **Debbie 56:04 (3rd Fv60).**

The following weekend three Pacers took on an epic challenge of running the **Dales Way** long distance path from Bowness on Windermere back to Ilkley. This 78 mile route traverses some spectacular scenery, flirting with the Three Peaks at Ribblehead and picking up the infant River Wharfe at Hubberholme before heading off down the Wharfe Valley to Ilkley via Grassington and Burnsall. With mixed weather and very wet conditions underfoot, **Carole Keighley, Louise Biddulph and Debbie Bland** made short work of the first two stages, stopping at Kendal and then Dent before heading off over Blea Moor to Ribblehead and on to Hubberholme en route to Ilkley.

Sadly Debbie had to bow out at Dent having contracted food poisoning but Carole and Louise pressed on completing the challenge on Monday 27th after four hard days of Run/Walking. Congratulations to them and happily after a few days Debbie recovered sufficiently to get back in the saddle again for Bradford parkrun the following weekend !

Sneaking into the first weekend of April for our finale !

New member **Jack Ogalbe**, racing for the first time in his Pacers vest, took on the tough **Bramham Park Trail half marathon**. Jack opened his Pacers account with a superb first place in 1:34:54 !

Meanwhile, quite a long way South, **Sarah Podesta** journeyed back to her home island of **Guernsey** to tackle the islands marathon. On an eventful day which saw her carefully curated musical motivation disappear off into the grass at the 13 mile mark, Sarah pressed on silently and finished in 4:25:45 (gun time) and then had to go off in search of her lost tunes ! Happily they were eventually re discovered in the long grass so smiles all round.

Last but not least the 2023 **Baildon Boundary Way** took place on the 2nd April – as tough a test of stamina as you will get at half marathon distance with plenty of mud after a wet week prior. Three Pacers took up the challenge and all had good races – **Tom Gifford** was first Pacer home in **2:15:06** followed by **Graham Turner in 2:17:20** and not far behind, **Sophie Bromley in 2:21:00.** The race winner was Ilkley Harrier Jack Cummings continuing his winning form from the Keighley 10k taking the tape in a blistering 1:21:03 – first lady home was Hinda Hardaker (Keighley & Craven) in 1:43:34.

This will give our members aged 35+ access to a range of Championship and Grand Prix events covering Road, Off Road and Fell events at a variety of venues across Yorkshire. The next race is the **Grand Prix at Honley (Huddersfield) on 23rd April**. Only a fiver to enter to cover the bunfight afterwards. This is a mixed terrain race mainly on paths and trails in woodland with a fair bit of climb in the first half. These races are well supported by local clubs and pretty competitive.

Also coming up (4th June) is the **YVAA Road Relay Championships** held just outside Holmfirth. Based at Cartworth Moor cricket club the relays will be 3 x 1 mile out and back laps on very quiet lanes. Teams of three in the usual age groups (£18 per team). Medals and prizes in all age groups. 2pm kick off.
